

MARCH 2018, OUT AND ABOUT IN NEW ORLEANS: JAZZ, JAMBALAYA, AND JOIE DE VIVRE. Enjoy 6 days/5nights at an historic hotel in the French Quarter. See the magic of New Orleans: Jazz on Bourbon Street, a miraculous bowl of gumbo, a Garden District mansion. Discover the literary landmarks of Tennessee Williams, meet a Mardi Gras Indian, learn the secrets of creole cooking from a local chef, etc. Visit the WW II Museum and the Museum of Art, and have an expert lead exploration of the Garden District.
